

***Proceedings of the 7th European Conference of Iranian Studies (ECIS 7)***  
**Guidelines for proceedings submissions**

All Participants who presented their papers are invited to submit them in electronic version in MS Word rtf (rich text format) or compatible for consideration in the conference proceedings (PDF version is necessary and must be identical with the text). All submissions will be reviewed by at least two readers who will make suggestions and recommendations to the authors and the editors. According to the guidelines for submission, the papers should:

- be doubled spaced and include no more than 3000 words (excluding references, tables, notes, appendices etc.)
- be formatted in Microsoft Word (Word XP 2002) for Windows. The maximum number of pages allowed is 12, including examples, references, and appendices. Please use Times New Roman, 12 point font (symbol and font files, if used, should be included in the e-mail as well)
- include an abstract of no more than 150 words (it should include as few references as possible. The abstract should be in 10-pt characters)
- include information about the author(s): name, affiliation, address, telephone number, and email address

Moreover:

1. The “Works Cited” section (Bibliography) shall come at the very end of the paper.

Example:

**Allen, J. W. (1991). *Metalwork of the Turcoman Dynasties of Eastern Anatolia and Iran. Iran 29 (1991), pp. 153-159.***

**Christensen, A. E. (1932). *Les Kayanides. Copenhagen.***

References (footnotes) are in 11-pt type. Make sure your references are as complete, accurate, and up-to-date as possible.

2. Do not refer to page numbers anywhere in your text. Use section numbers instead. Make sure that there are no page numbers on your PDF copy, either.

3. When citing linguistic material within running text, italicize it, *comme ça* ‘like that’. Italics are also used to indicate *emphasis*; do not use boldface for emphasis (in the text; it’s fine in example sentences, to highlight a particular morpheme for example). Follow traditional publishers’ guidelines for the relative placement of quotation marks and other punctuation; in particular, periods and commas are placed within double quotation marks, outside of single quotes (which are used to set off special terms or glosses, as in the first sentence of this paragraph); colons and semicolons appear outside of both single and double quotes.

3. The texts should be sent only when they meet the stylistic and linguistic requirements on the level of perfection.

4. Papers in Persian will not be published.
